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CHURCH BOOK OF CLEAR CREEK MCNAIRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

The following records were copied from the original minute book of the Clear Creek Church of McNairy Co., Tenn., and are contributed to FAMILY FINDINGS by Mrs. Vivian Perkins Harrison, 1572 Overton Park, Apt. #11, Memphis, Tennessee. Due to the fact that these records are so lengthy, we plan to publish some of them in each issue until completed.

Record of the Clear Creek Church met on Saturday the 15th of February 1841.

Being called to order preceeded to business and after various exertions to settle the old difficulties existing in the church it was ascertained that they could not be settled without a division in the church. It was resolved that the following proposition should be submitted. (Viz)

All persons who are willing to live together and serve the Lord according to the Bible and the Bible alone and to acknowledge all their falts and to forgive each other all former trespasses will make it known by coming forward and giving Brother JOHN H. JONES the right hand of fellowship.

It was also furthermore resolved (Viz) That all those who would come forward on the above resolution after sufficient time had been given them should be considered as manifesting an unwillingness to conform to the rules and regulations of the Church of Christ and therefore should be withdrawn from.

By order of the Church.

Met on Saturday before the 2nd Lord's Day in April A.D. 1842

The Brethern being called to order. The case of BROTHER MARK H. WILSON was taken up. He being accused of intoxication and fighting and not present to answer to said charges. The Brethren from the best evidence they could get, believed it their duty to withdraw from him, -- which they did.

The case of BROTHER I. FOWLER was also taken up. He was charged of having been drunk and wanting to fight but for want of evidence the case was laid over until the 2nd Lords day in May.

The cases of certain delinquents. WILLIAM ERWIN, MARY ERWIN, JOHN KENDRICK, MATILDA KENDRICK, JOHN P. ERWIN, MINERVA ERWIN, THOMAS KENDRICK, WILLIAM KENDRICK. Were taken up and according to a resolution passed by the Church on Saturday 15th of February Eighteen Hundred & Forty One, they were withdrawn from.

As two of the Brethern (WILLIAM ERWIN & JOHN KENDRICK) withdrawn from were Elders in the Church upon their exclusion it became necessary for the Church to appoint others in their stead. Accordingly, WILLIAM SHELBY and JAMES KERR were chosen to be ordained the 2nd Lord's day in May, by JOHN H. JONES and JOHN DUNN and in case of failure in the case of on the part of JOHN DUNN, Elder WILLIAM USSERY was to act in his stead.

Met on the 2nd Lord's day in May.

The case of Brother JOHN FOWLER was taken up. From the evidence presented on the case it was not believed that he was guilty of intoxication. But that of wanting to fight and as he did not seem to manifest that Penitent disposition required it was thought advisable to lay his case over until 2nd Lord's Day in June.

The ordination of the nominated Elders was next attended to. As Brother DUNN was not present, Elder WILLIAM USSERY and JOHN H. JONES, proceeded to and ordained them according to the New Testament form. (Viz)

Sister MARTHA WILSON made application for a letter of dismission from the Church. The Church Clerk was authorized to write her one whenever called for. THOS. R. HECK, C.C.

Met on 2nd Lord's day in June. The case of Brother FOWLER was laid over until Saturday before the 2nd Lord's day in July. By order of the Church

Met on the Saturday before the 2nd Lord's day in July the case of JOHN L. FOWLER was taken up and as he failed to give satisfaction the Elders proclaimed it be the duty of the Church to withdraw from him which they accordingly did. By order of the Church.

Met on the Saturday before our 2nd Lord's day in February, 1843. JOHN H. JONES and Elder JAMES H. KERR proceeded and ordained JOHN W. BROWL Deacon according to the New Testament order.

THOS. R. BECK, C.C.

Met on the 2nd Lord's day in January 1844 and the Church being by report in possession of news that JOHN DISBANE (John D. Spane) had been dancing requested Elder KERR to go and see him before the next meeting. By order of the Church.

Met on Saturday before the 2nd Lord's day in February and proceeded to business the case of JOHN D. SPANE was taken up. Elder KERR stated he had seen D. SPANE and he acknowledged he had been dancing and fighting and said he had no desire to live a Christian life. The Elders therefore, proclaimed it to be the duty of the Church to withdraw from him, which they accordingly did by order of the Church.

Met on the second Lord's day in March the following brethern and sisters applied for letters of dismission:

Viz: JOHN H. DUNN, ELIZABETH M. DUNN, PATSY S. DUNN, ABEDNEGO BASE, MARY BASE, RICHARD CHANDLER, ELIZABETH CHANDLER, SQUIRE BASE and Lawrence, Bro. Abenego Basets negro boy.

The Church authorized the Church Clerk to write them and hand them over when applied for.

Done by order of the Church.

Met on the second Lord's day in June 1844 and proceeded to business the case of Brother SAMUEL PERKINS and Brother FELISE G. BRADEN was taken up the former accused the latter of violating his promise in not paying him a debt when he had the means in his hands after having pledged his word, and honour to do so which charge was not denied. Brother BRADEN refusing to make any acknowledgment the Elders proclaimed it to be the duty of the Church to withdraw their

fellowship from him which they did. THOS. R. BECK. Church Clerk

Met on the 2nd Lord's day in November.

Brother JOHN G. BRADEN, his wife, CATHARINE and daughter ELEANOR applied for letters of dismission and recomendation the Church authorized the Church Clerk to write them when called on -- done by order of the Church.

Met on the 4th Lord's day in November.

Brother JOHN B. SHELBY and his wife, NANCY applied for letters of dismission and recommendation. The Church authorized the Church Clerk to write them when called on - Done by order of the Church.

Met on the 11th of January 1845.

Sister MARY HUGHLETT and her daughter, MARY, applied for letters of recommendation. The Church authorized their Clerk to write them when called for.

Met on the Saturday the 9th of March.

The case of Brother DAVID SMITH was taken up, he having been accused of swearying the elders admonished him to do better and come to the Church and make acknowledgment. He refused, therefore, the Elders proclaimed it to be the duty of the Church to withdraw their fellowship from him, when they did.

Met on the 2nd Lords day in May.

Sister MARY USSERY applied for a letter of dismission and recommendation. The Church authorized their Clerk to write it and hand it over when applied for. Done by order of the Church 1845.

Met on the 2nd Lords day in September 1844.

The case of excluding Brother BRADEN was taken up, he made satisfaction for the charges for which he was excluded, and consequently was restored to full fellowship.

Met September 1844 the case of excluding the following Brethern and sisters was taken up (Viz) Bro. WILLIAM ERWIN and wife, JOHN A. KENDRICK, JOHN P. ERWIN, and wife, THOMAS KENDRICK and WILLIAM KENDRICK. They made satisfaction for the charge for which they were excluded the 2nd Lord's day of April 1842 and were restored to full fellowship. Done by order of the Church.

THOS. R. BECK, Church Clerk.

1847 met on 3rd Lord's day in September and the case of ordaining Brother JAMES H. KERR an Evangelist was taken up. It was agreed that on Monday following that Brother YOUNG and HACKWORTH should ordain him.

Accordingly on Monday, following: The Brethern selected, proceeded and

ordained Brother KERR to the office of Evangelist. Done by order of the Church. As Brother KERR was ordained an Evangelist, was an Elder it became the duty of the Church to appoint another to act in his stead. Consequently Brother BASWELL G. EAST was selected and on Wednesday 22nd of September 1847 was by Brother YOUNG AND KERR ordained Elder of the Church.

1848. Met on 3rd Lord's day in May.

Application was made to the Church for a letter of Dismission and recommendation for Sister PRESCILLA KERR the Church granted the request and ordered their Clerk to write the same.

Done by order of the Church. T. R. BECK, C. C.

VMet on the 2nd Lord's Day in August, 1848.

The case of Bro. F. G. BRADEN and children was taken up. He was charged with immoral conduct and propigating heretical doctrine. The Elders also have received a letter from them assigned by FELIA G. BRADEN, WILLIAM, MARGARETTE and FRANCES informing them that they wished to withdraw from the Church and they wished the Church to be no longer responsible for their conduct. Therefore, the Elders proclaimed it to be the duty of the Church to withdraw from them which they did, done by order of the Church.

The case of Brother WILLIAM ERWINwas taken up he was charged of lying concerning the age and soundness of a mule, by which means he defrauded the purchaser. This was proved on him to the satisfaction of the Church. He refused to make such acknowledgments as the Church required therefore, he was withdrawn from. Done by order of the Church.

June the 12th, 1853

The Church was in possession of a letter from LUCINDA BRADDEN dated April 1st, 1853, Quitman, Texas, in which she acknowledges her faults in committing the crime for which she was excluded and desires to be forgiven by the brethern of this Church, on the reception of this the Church restored her to fellowship and authorized their Clerk to inform her of her restoration.

Met on the 4th Lord's Day in July

The case of JAMES W. MICHIE was taken up he was charged of being drunk and having gambled these charges were sustained and after repeated admonitions from the Elders he failing to forsake these sins the Church withdrew their fellowship from him.

 $\sqrt{0n \text{ the 6th of August 1853}}$ Sister NANCY STACY applied for a letter of recommendation from the Church which was granted.

Met Saturday before the 4th Lord's Day in August 1853.

The case of charges against Brother G. B. BABB by B. T. BABB was taken up. Charge 1st for forceably throwing the latter off of his horse and personal abuse. Acknowledged by G. B. BABB. Charge 2nd of accusing B. T. BABB of stealing by withholding a twenty dollar bill in change of money. Charge 3rd for abusing B. T. BABB'S wife by using disrespectful language towards her. After examination had on the first two cases above it was ascertained that Brother GREEN B. BABB was guilty. The Elders ordered that he should make satisfaction by acknowledgment of his faults and personally promise to do so no more - - which things he did. The third charge was not sustained by my evidence. Done by order of the Church.

Met on the 4th Lord's Day in September 1853.

Sister MARIAH GREEN applied for a letter of dismission and recommendation which the Church granted.

On the 4th Sunday in January 1854.

Brother WTILIAM USSERY applied for a letter of recommendation from this Church for himself and l_i negro girls. Which the Church granted. Brother USSERY returned this letter and was received in the Church.

<u>May 28th</u>. The case of WILLIAM BROMLEY was taken up. The charge was of not paying over money to Mr. W. CHERRY after it was placed in his hand by R. W. JONES and he had promised in presents of the Elders to do so. The Church thought it proper to withdraw their fellowship from him which they did.

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- <u>On the 2nd Lord's day in October 1854</u> BRIAND T. BABB applied for a letter of recommendation his conduct previous to this time was such as to justify the Church in refusing his request which they did. Done by order of the Church. T. R. BECK, C.C.
- <u>6 On the 2nd Lord's Day in October 1854</u>. Brother WILLIAM I. PETTIGREW presented a letter of recommendation and also some acknowledgments. The Church rec'd him in full fellowship.
- April 1855. Brother WILLIAM H. SHELBY and Brother NICHOLAS A. McKENZIE and wife applied for letters of recommendation which the Church granted.
- V On the 4th Lord's Day in July Sister LOUISA SHELBY applied to the Church for a letter of dismission and recommendation which the church granted.
- <u>On the 4th Lord's Day in July</u> Brother WILLIAM ERWIN who had been excluded from this Church some time lapsed came forward and made satisfaction for his crime and was restored to full fellowship.
- VOn Sunday the 11th of May 1856. Sister LAVINA NORVILLE applied for a letter of recommendation which the Church granted. Done by order of the Church.
- <u>On the 2nd Lord's day in April 1856</u> Brother ABNER FARTHING applied for a letter of recommendation which the Church granted.

The Church met on Wednesday the 15th of August proceeded to business the case of Brother ALLEN DENDRICK was taken up. He was charged by the Church 1st of indulging too freely in the use of ardent spirits or to speak plainer for intoxication at Farmington, Mississippi and various other places. 2nd for ungentlemanly and unchristian conduct at your own house on a day or days last year before or in the presence of your own family and other persons both male and female. 3rd for absenting yourself from the Church he denies and the Church affirms. After a full investigation of the case the Church believed that the charges prefered were sustained by incontrovertable evidence. In addition to the charges of going into groceries treating and drinking with the drunken which charges he admitted to be true and attempted to justify himself in the act. Therefore, the Church withdrew there fellowship from him. Done by order of the Church. August 15th, 1856.

<u>Met on Saturday November 27th, 1858</u>. The case of WILLIAM DUNN, GEORGE SHELBY and FRANKLIN TANNER was taken all were fuilty of drunkness and rioting for which they were excluded. (FRANKLIN TANNER made satisfaction of his offence.)

THE YOUNG MEN'S MAGAZINE, Vol. II, No. 7, December 1858 carried the following article:

Jackson, Tenn. -- At the last meeting the address was delivered by Dr. Jackson whose subject was "Matrimony" in which he came down on old bachelors in a very unfeeling almost unchristian manner. The West Tennessee "Whig" says of the doctor's effort:

"He showed by high and indisputable authority, that a 'good wife is the gift of God', and that man has never been happy without woman, nor woman without man, since the eternal fiat went forth that 'it is not good for man to be alone.' The doctor says in order to give the proper training 'the animal should be caught young,' and argues from this that it is better for a woman to marry a widower of forty than a bachelor of the same age as it is believed that by the time a man arrives at that age, without the refining influences of women thrown about him, there is an encrustation formed around the heart that is impervious to the arrows of Cupid."

Strange, says the N. O. "Bulletin," that a Christian association should tolerate such hard-hearted sentiments! It is full enough that the hearts of old bachelors should be kept constantly bleeding by the jiltings which they constantly get, without being twitted about their misfortunes in this cruel way. The doctor has doubtless become so accustomed to the use of the lancet that he can cut up a human heart with as much nonchalance as Dinan would manifest in dressing chickens.
